



Waxing Your Chain Using Enigma Black Edition Ultimate Chain Wax

Things You'll Need

- Deep Cleaned Chain - See deep clean chain instructions
- Enigma Wax
- Slow cooker (ideally one that reaches 110 centigrade/230 Fahrenheit)
- Metal coat hanger or thick fairly rigid wire.
- Thermometer

Step 1

Tip Enigma Wax into a clean and dry slow cooker (we recommend the Quest 35260 1.5L)

Turn the cooker on high



Step 2

Bend a metal coat hanger to loop a chain through (see photo)



Step 3

Feed the chain through the coat hanger

Make sure chain has been deep Cleaned first or if its been previously waxed in Enigma give it a wipe and follow the same instructions)

Step 4

Place the chain on top of the wax
(in the slow cooker) and replace the lid

Note more than one chain can be treated at a time.

Step 5

Allow the wax to melt and reach 110 centigrade (some cookers will only reach 95 which isn't an issue, it just take a little longer to work its way into the rollers and links.

Step 6

Move the chain round the slow cooker basin making sure the links bend - thus allowing the wax to fully penetrate the chain. Make sure the chain is fully submerged in the wax.

Step 7

Turn the cooker off and allow the temperature to drop to 80 centigrade, once it has give the chain a final move around the basin and remove.

Step 8

Take the chain off the hanger all apart from the last link and hang to dry/cool.

Step 9

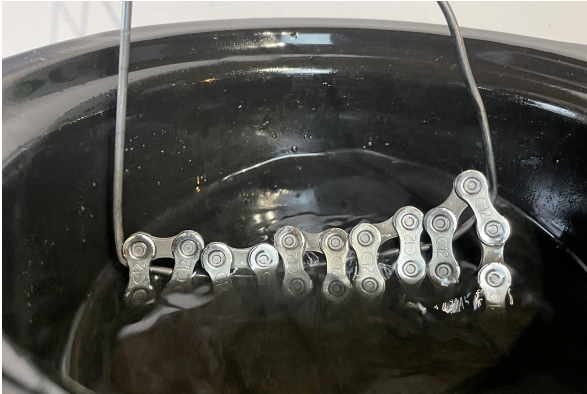
When it is cool remove the chain from the hanger and bend each link.

Step 10

Install the chain on to the bike.

Step 11

For the first few miles the chain will need to be broken in to loosen any excess wax, once this has happened the chain is fully optimised and you will now benefit from lower friction. (This is done just by riding the bike normally)
